OBSERVATION

David was a strong and courageous leader. He defeated Goliath, led armies, and became king of Israel. Yet one of his greatest strengths was his kindness. Even when King Saul tried to harm him, David chose not to take revenge. Later, David showed kindness to Mephibosheth, the son of his friend Jonathan, by caring for him and giving him a place at the king's table (2 Samuel 9). David showed that kindness is not weakness—it is strength under God's control.

APPLICATION

Sometimes people think being kind means being weak. But Godly leaders are strong enough to care for others, speak kindly, forgive, and help those in need. Like David, we can use our strength to bless people instead of hurting them. At school, at home, and with friends, we can show kindness through our words and actions.

**Challenge:** Look for someone who needs help today and offer your assistance.

## Kindness Reflects God's Love

Read: **Colossians 3:12**



**Reflection:** God calls His children to clothe themselves with kindness. When we are kind, we show others what God is like. Every act of kindness, no matter how small, can point people to God's love and make the world a better place.

**Challenge:** At the end of the day, write down three ways you showed kindness this week and thank God for helping you be a strong and kind leader.
