SCRIPTURE

Paul was talking to Timothy to live by example. Timothy was young, and he was a leader. Paul encouraged him to lead others in how he lived. He made good choices, stayed faithful, and set an example for others. He didn’t wait to grow up to lead—he led himself first, and others followed.

OBSERVATION

A

You don’t have to be older to be a leader. Every time you are responsible, do your best, make good choices, and stay disciplined—you are leading! When you lead yourself well, others will see it and follow your example.

APPLICATION

Dear God, thank You that I am a leader. Help me to lead myself well every day by being responsible, making good choices, and doing my best. Let my life be a good example to others. Amen.

MONDAY

I Am Responsible for Me
Read *Galatians 6:5*

Reflection: Daniel was taken far from home and given a new life in a foreign land, but he chose to take responsibility for his actions. Even when no one was watching, he chose to obey God and do what was right. He didn't wait for others to tell him; he led himself well.

Challenge: Being a leader starts with taking responsibility for your own choices. Today choose to obey, be kind, and do your work well; even when no one is reminding you.

WEDNESDAY

I Can Be Trusted
Read *Luke 16:10*

Reflection: Before David became king, he took care of sheep. He protected them and did his job faithfully. Because he was responsible in small things, God trusted him with something bigger— a king— leading a whole nation.

Challenge: Today, start being faithful with small responsibilities, like homework, chores, or being honest; people will learn they can trust you.

TUESDAY

Doing My Work Well

Read *Colossians 3:23*

Reflection: Joseph in the Bible was given many responsibilities, even as a servant and in prison. But he worked hard and did everything with excellence. Because he was responsible, people trusted him with bigger things.

Challenge: When you finish your work today, clean up, or help at home or school, do it your best. Responsible leaders don't do things halfway; they give their all.

THURSDAY

Making the Right Choices
Read *Proverbs 4:25-26*

Reflection: Esther had to make a very brave and responsible choice. She chose to speak up and help her people, even when it was scary. She didn't ignore the problem; she stepped up and did what was right.

Challenge: Make good choices today. Responsible leaders make good choices, even when it's hard. You can choose to tell the truth, be kind, and stand up for what is right.

FRIDAY

Leading Myself Every Day
Read *1 Corinthians 9:27*

Reflection: Paul taught that leading yourself takes discipline. He chose to stay focused, obey God, and do what was right—even when it was hard. He didn't let his feelings control him; he led himself well.

Challenge: Leading yourself means doing the right thing even when you don't feel like it. This week, listen more to your friends, obey your parents, and stay focused in class.
