Spirit-Led, Spirit-Empowered

Zechariah 4:6 (NIV)

“Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,” says the Lord Almighty.”

These words were spoken by God to Zerubbabel through the prophet Zechariah. Zerubbabel had been entrusted with the daunting task of rebuilding the Temple after Israel’s return from exile. Yet the work had stalled for sixteen years due to opposition, discouragement, and fear. The ruins of the Temple stood as a reminder of what remained unfinished, while comparisons to Solomon’s Temple only deepened the sense of inadequacy.

Into that moment, God spoke a powerful promise: “Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit.” The success of the mission would not depend on human strength, resources, influence, or determination. God Himself would accomplish what He had begun through the power of His Spirit. No opposition, delay, or obstacle would be able to stand in the way of His purposes.

The same is true for us today.

The Holy Spirit leads us into God’s purposes and empowers us to accomplish what we could never achieve in our own strength. Everything God calls us to be and do—whether in our personal lives, families, workplaces, communities, or ministry—depends upon His presence and power.

As we reach the midpoint of 2026, we can look back and see countless ways the Lord has faithfully led and sustained us. While there have been victories to celebrate, there have also been challenges to overcome and mountains to climb. Yet the promise remains the same: the Holy Spirit is with us. He continues to guide, strengthen, and empower us as we walk toward God's purposes for our lives.

As we enter this week of prayer and fasting, may our hearts be drawn afresh to the Holy Spirit. May we listen for His voice, depend upon His strength, and trust Him to accomplish all that God has planned for us in the months ahead.

As You Pray This Week:



Open your heart to the Holy Spirit and desire a fresh encounter with Him. He longs to reveal Jesus to you more deeply and work powerfully in your life.



Come before the Lord in faith, confident that He is able to fulfil His promises and accomplish His purposes in every area of your life.



Set aside distractions and intentionally make room for God's presence. As you seek Him in prayer and fasting, trust that He will speak, strengthen, guide, and prepare you for the season ahead.

Here are some things to note:

- Prayer can be defined as communing or fellowshiping with God. This includes us asking and making requests to God, as well as allowing time for Him to respond.
- Fasting is essentially giving up food (or something else) for a period of time in order to spend that time communing/fellowshipping with God.
- Therefore, prayer and fasting can be defined as the discipline of disconnecting oneself from the world and connecting with God.
- The Scriptures have taught us directly and by the examples of people in the Bible, that prayer and fasting is something important for us as God's people.

Reasons we fast include:

- To spend time with God (*Ex. 34:28*)
- To ask for guidance and direction on major life issues (*Acts 13:1-3, Judges 20:26-28*)
- For Spiritual strength when going through a trial (*Luke 4:1-2, 2 Sam.12:16-17*)
- To seek favor (*Esther 4:15-16, Nehemiah 1:4,11*)
- To seek God's divine intervention (*Daniel 10:3, Matt. 7:20-21*)
- To experience victory over sin and bondage (*Is. 58:6, Mark. 9:25- 29*)

Types of fasts include:

A Regular Fast: where we refrain from eating food but drink water or juice during the fast

A Partial Fast (Daniel fast): where we omit a specific meal (breakfast, lunch, dinner) or refrain from certain types of foods (*Daniel 10:2-3, Daniel 1:12*)

A Full (absolute) Fast: where we refrain from food and drink completely. *Acts 9:9* and *Esther 4:15-16*. We recommend that this type of fast be done with wisdom and counsel

The effectiveness of prayer and fasting is not in the number of words we use while praying or the amount of time we stay away from food and drink. It is not in the measure of suffering we endure while fasting. But rather in the genuine desire to connect with God during the time of prayer and fasting (*Psalms 27:8 NLT*). Don't place your trust in the fasting, place your trust in God.

Prayerfully prepare and decide which kind of fast you will do for the next week as we spend time in the presence of God.

Day 1: Remember His Works

Psalm 103:1-5 (AMP)

“Bless and affectionately praise the Lord, O my soul, And all that is [deep] within me, bless His holy name. Bless and affectionately praise the Lord, O my soul, And do not forget any of His benefits; Who forgives all your sins, Who heals all your diseases; Who redeems your life from the pit, Who crowns you [lavishly] with lovingkindness and tender mercy; Who satisfies your years with good things, So that your youth is renewed like the [soaring] eagle.”

As we begin this week of prayer and fasting, we start where God’s people have always begun—with thanksgiving. Before we bring our requests to the Lord, we pause to remember His great works. Psalm 103 calls us to intentionally recall the goodness of God and all that He has done for us.

Our theme for this week is Spirit-Led, Spirit-Empowered. It is the Holy Spirit who helps us remember God’s goodness, recognize His hand at work in our lives, and respond with grateful hearts. Thanksgiving is more than a response to what God has done; it is an act of faith that acknowledges God’s presence and activity in every season of life.

Interestingly, scientists have discovered that when we intentionally remember good things, our brains release chemicals that strengthen feelings of joy, peace, and well-being. Those memories become easier to recall and more influential

in shaping how we think and respond. In other words, what we choose to remember grows stronger. Long before science explained it, Scripture instructed us to “forget not all His benefits.” God knows that when we continually remember His faithfulness, our hearts are strengthened with hope, gratitude, and trust in Him.

The first half of the year may have brought moments of celebration as well as seasons of challenge and uncertainty. Yet through it all, God has remained faithful. He has sustained us, guided us, provided for us, protected us, comforted us, corrected us, and drawn us closer to Himself. Whether His hand was obvious or hidden, His Spirit has been at work, accomplishing His purposes in our lives, families, church, and nation.

Today, let us take time to remember His works and give Him thanks. As we do, may our hearts be filled with renewed faith, fresh hope, and deeper confidence in the God who has been faithful in the past and will remain faithful in the days ahead.

As you spend time in thanksgiving, meditate on these additional scriptures:

2 Kings 5:1-15, Luke 17:11-19, Colossians 2:6-7, 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.

Day 2: A Heart Made New

Ezekiel 36:22-28 (NIV)

“Therefore say to the Israelites, ‘This is what the Sovereign Lord says: It is not for your sake, people of Israel, that I am going to do these things, but for the sake of my holy name, which you have profaned among the nations where you have gone. I will show the holiness of my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, the name you have profaned among them. Then the nations will know that I am the Lord, declares the Sovereign Lord, when I am proved holy through you before their eyes. “ ‘For I will take you out of the nations; I will gather you from all the countries and bring you back into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your impurities and from all your idols. I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws. Then you will live in the land I gave your ancestors; you will be my people, and I will be your God.”

Reflection

God chose Israel to be a people through whom the nations would see His glory. He rescued them from slavery, established His covenant with them, and brought them into a land flowing with milk and honey. Their lives were meant to reflect His goodness and holiness to the world.

Yet over time, their hearts drifted from Him. They embraced the practices of the nations around them, exchanged devotion for compromise, and dishonoured the God who had been so faithful to them. Though God had given them His law, their hearts remained unchanged, and their rebellion eventually led them into exile. But failure would not have the final word.

Through Ezekiel, God reveals the depth of His mercy. He promises to cleanse His people, remove their heart of stone, give them a heart of flesh, and put His Spirit within them. What the law could not accomplish from the outside, God would accomplish by His Spirit from within.

This is the beauty of the gospel: God does not merely forgive our sin; He gives us a new heart and empowers us by His Spirit to walk in His ways.

Truth for Us

Our theme this week is Spirit-Led, Spirit-Empowered. Before the Spirit empowers us for ministry, witness, or breakthrough, He first transforms us from within. The Christian life is not about trying harder; it is about surrendering more deeply to the work of the Holy Spirit.

As we reach the midpoint of the year, this is an opportunity to allow God to search our hearts. Have compromise, distraction, pride, unforgiveness, hidden sin, or spiritual complacency found a place in our lives? Have our hearts grown cold toward God? The good news is that God still pursues His people. He is rich in mercy and eager to restore. The same God who promised Israel a new heart offers us ongoing renewal through His Spirit today.

Like David, let us pray: “Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting” (Psalm 139:23-24)

Prayer Direction



Personal Prayer

Repent

Humbly acknowledge areas of sin, disobedience, compromise, pride, and spiritual drift. Invite the Lord to search your heart and reveal anything that grieves Him.

Re-surrender

Lay every part of your life before the Lord once again—your plans, priorities, relationships, ambitions, resources, and future. Invite Him to take His rightful place on the throne of your heart. Pray that your life would be fully yielded to God's will and purposes, holding nothing back from Him.

Recommit

Make a fresh commitment to walk in obedience to God and His Word. Ask Him for the grace to follow Him faithfully, even when it is difficult.

Pray that God would give you a tender heart that delights in Him, loves His ways, and desires to honour Him in every area of life.

Receive

Invite the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh with His presence and power. Receive His strength, wisdom, joy, discernment, and grace for every area of your life. Pray that the Holy Spirit would empower you to live a life that honours God and move you to walk faithfully in His ways.



Prayer for Our Families

Repent

- Stand in the gap on behalf of your family and ask God to forgive areas where you have fallen short of His design and purpose.
- Pray against:
- Prayerlessness and spiritual complacency.
- Broken relationships, conflict, and division.
- Divorce and marital unfaithfulness.
- Addiction to alcohol, drugs, and other destructive habits.
- Greed, materialism, and misplaced priorities.
- Parents neglecting their God-given responsibility to nurture and disciple their children.
- Every form of idol worship, witchcraft, sorcery, and reliance on ungodly spiritual practices.

Renewal by the Spirit

- Pray for a fresh work of the Holy Spirit in every household represented within your family.
- Ask the Lord to bring:
- Salvation to family members who do not yet know Christ.
- Forgiveness, healing, and reconciliation where relationships have been broken.
- Freedom from addiction and destructive patterns of behaviour.
- Restoration of marriages and strengthening of family bonds.

- Contentment, generosity, and faithful stewardship.
- A turning away from idol worship, witchcraft, and every practice that dishonours God.
- A renewed hunger for God's Word, prayer, and the presence of the Holy Spirit.
- Provision, protection, and sustenance for every family in the months ahead.
- Pray that your family would become a testimony of God's grace, reflecting His love, holiness, and faithfulness to the next generation.

Today's Challenge:

- Initiate a family gathering in the near future and introduce the idea of a regular family prayer gathering. Ask Holy Spirit to lead you as you present this with conviction so that He can empower you to start a culture of prayer as a family. This could be the start of healing and revival in your family.
 - As a family, revisit your family vision statement and commitments. Review your progress and prayerfully commit to leaning on the Lord for His help in accomplishing what He has set before you for the year, 2026.

Day 3: O Mighty Mountain

Zechariah 4:6-10 (NIV)

[6] So he said to me, "This is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel: 'Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,' says the Lord Almighty. [7] "What are you, mighty mountain? Before Zerubbabel you will become level ground. Then he will bring out the capstone to shouts of 'God bless it! God bless it!' "
[8] Then the word of the Lord came to me: [9] "The hands of Zerubbabel have laid the foundation of this temple; his hands will also complete it. Then you will know that the Lord Almighty has sent me to you. [10] "Who dares despise the day of small things, since the seven eyes of the Lord that range throughout the earth will rejoice when they see the chosen capstone in the hand of Zerubbabel?"

Reflection

Zerubbabel had been entrusted with the daunting task of rebuilding the Temple. It was a God-given assignment, yet everywhere he looked there was opposition, discouragement, and uncertainty. The task seemed far greater than his ability, resources, and strength.

In the midst of these challenges, God reminded Zerubbabel that His purposes would not be accomplished through human effort alone. "Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit," says the Lord Almighty (Zechariah 4:6). The same Spirit who brought order out of chaos at creation would empower Zerubbabel to

complete the work God had called him to do. The mountain standing before him was real, but it was not greater than God. Though the obstacles appeared overwhelming, the Lord declared that they would become level ground before him. What seemed impossible in human strength would be accomplished through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Truth for Us

Like Zerubbabel, we often find ourselves facing mountains that seem impossible to overcome—delays, disappointments, fears, sickness, financial pressures, broken relationships, unanswered prayers, and uncertainties about the future.

Yet Spirit-empowered faith reminds us that our confidence is not in our own strength, wisdom, or ability. Our confidence is in God. The Holy Spirit enables us to trust Him even when we cannot see the way forward, knowing that He is faithful to complete what He has begun.

As we enter the second half of the year, let us bring every mountain before the Lord. No obstacle is greater than His power, and no circumstance is beyond His control. The God who called us is faithful, and by His Spirit He will accomplish all that He has purposed for our lives.

“He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.” — Philippians 1:6

Scriptures to meditate on:

Proverbs 16:3, 16:9, Philippians 4:6-8, Psalm 121, Joshua 23:14

Prayer Direction

- Submit your dreams, plans, desires, and goals for the second half of the year to the Lord. Ask Him to guide your steps, align your heart with His will, and establish His purposes in your life.
- Commit to the Lord any pending resolutions, unanswered prayers, unfinished assignments, major decisions, or areas where you are trusting Him for breakthrough and direction.
- Bring before the Lord every mountain and obstacle standing in the way of His purposes for your life and family. Surrender every fear, worry, disappointment, delay, setback, weakness, sickness, financial challenge, strained relationship, addiction, temptation, uncertainty, and closed door to Him.
- Pray for God's intervention in areas where you feel stuck, discouraged, overwhelmed, or unable to move forward. Ask Him to make a way where there seems to be no way.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen your faith and help you trust God's promises, even when circumstances seem impossible. Pray for courage to obey, patience to wait, and confidence in God's timing.
- Pray that every mountain before you would become level ground as the Lord accomplishes His purposes in and through your life.
- Thank God in advance for the victories, breakthroughs, provision, healing, restoration, and answered prayers that He will bring to pass according to His perfect will.
- Pray for Spirit-empowered faith—a faith that sees beyond obstacles, trusts God completely, and believes that He who began a good work in you will be faithful to complete it.

Today's Challenge:

- Take a sheet of paper and write down the three biggest “mountains” you are currently facing. These may be personal, spiritual, relational, financial, academic, professional, or family-related. Next to each one, write a promise from God’s Word that strengthens your faith. Keep this list somewhere visible and use it as a reminder to trust God in prayer throughout the second half of the year.
- Identify one step of faith that God is calling you to take concerning a dream, goal, assignment, or challenge you have been praying about. Prayerfully commit to taking that step within the next seven days, trusting that it is not by might nor by power, but by His Spirit, that God’s purposes are accomplished.

Day 4: Empowered To Be My Witnesses

Acts 1:8 NIV

8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”

Reflection

After His resurrection, Jesus spent forty days teaching His disciples about the Kingdom of God. They had walked with Him, witnessed His miracles, heard His teaching, and seen the power of God at work through His ministry. Yet as Jesus prepared to return to the Father, He made it clear that their greatest need was not more knowledge or experience—it was the power of the Holy Spirit.

He instructed them to wait for the promised Holy Spirit because the mission before them could not be accomplished through human effort alone. They needed divine power for a divine assignment.

On the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came just as Jesus had promised. Fearful disciples became bold witnesses. Ordinary men and women proclaimed the gospel with extraordinary power. The Holy Spirit empowered their preaching, teaching, leadership, and missionary journeys. He gave them courage in the face of persecution, worked miracles through them, and

enabled them to take the message of Jesus from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth.

The book of Acts is a testimony to what God can do through people who are fully surrendered to the Holy Spirit.

Truth for Us

The same Holy Spirit who empowered Jesus and the early Church is at work today. God has entrusted Watoto Church Ministries with a vision that is far greater than our own ability, wisdom, or strength. Every celebration service, every cell family, every outreach initiative, every vulnerable child cared for, every woman empowered, every community impacted, every leader developed, and every person reached through our ministry depends upon the work of the Holy Spirit.

Without Him, we can only accomplish human-sized results. But with Him, lives are transformed, communities are changed, and generations are impacted for the glory of God.

As we pray today, let us ask God for a fresh outpouring of His Spirit upon every expression of Watoto Church Ministries. The vision before us is great, but the Holy Spirit is greater. The work of God must always be accomplished by the Spirit of God.

Pray that God would bless every ministry expression at Watoto so that we would have more Kingdom impact than we've ever had before.

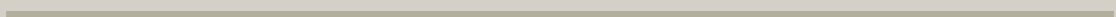
Pray for:

Today's Challenge:

- Ask the Holy Spirit to place one person on your heart who needs Jesus. Commit to praying for them by name every day for the rest of this month and look for an opportunity to encourage them, share your testimony, invite them to church, or have a gospel conversation with them. Each month, add someone new to your list.

- Identify one area of ministry where you can more intentionally participate in God's mission through Watoto Church. Ask the Holy Spirit how He would have you serve, give, lead, disciple, volunteer, or support the work of celebrating Christ and caring for community. Take one practical step toward that commitment this week.



Day 5: Revive Our Land

2 Chronicles 7:14 (NIV)

“If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.”

Reflection

Throughout Scripture, we see that whenever God desired to accomplish His purposes among His people, He worked by His Spirit. He raised up leaders, empowered prophets, transformed hearts, and called nations back to Himself. Human wisdom and political solutions alone were never enough; God’s people needed the intervention of His Spirit.

In 2 Chronicles 7:14, God gives a powerful promise to His people: if they humble themselves, pray, seek His face, and turn from their wicked ways, He will hear from heaven, forgive their sin, and heal their land. The healing of a nation begins with the repentance and renewal of God’s people.

The prophets repeatedly pointed to the work of the Holy Spirit as the source of true transformation. Isaiah declares that when the Spirit is poured out, righteousness, justice, peace, and flourishing follow (Isaiah 32:15-17). Ezekiel’s vision of the dry bones reminds us that no situation is beyond God’s power to restore. What appears lifeless and hopeless can live again when God breathes His Spirit upon it.

Throughout Israel's history, the Spirit of God empowered men and women to lead, deliver, and guide God's people according to His purposes. The lesson is clear: whenever God's Spirit moves, lives are transformed, leaders are strengthened, and nations are changed.

Truth for Us

Our theme this week is Spirit-Led, Spirit-Empowered. As we look at Uganda and South Sudan today, we recognise that our nations need more than economic growth, political stability, or human solutions. We need the transforming work of the Holy Spirit.

We long to see hearts turned back to God, families restored, communities healed, leaders governed by wisdom and integrity, and righteousness established in our land. We long to see peace where there is conflict, hope where there is despair, and justice where there is oppression.

The same Spirit who brought life to dry bones, empowered leaders for service, and transformed nations throughout Scripture is still at work today. Nothing is impossible for Him.

As we conclude this week of prayer and fasting, let us stand in the gap for Uganda and South Sudan, believing that God is able to do far more than we can ask or imagine. May He pour out His Spirit upon our nations and bring revival, renewal, healing, and transformation for His glory.

Scriptures you can meditate on:

Isaiah 32:15-17; Ezekiel 37:14

Prayer Direction

- Thank the Lord for sustaining our nation and keeping us from instability and chaos.
- Repent of all the injustice, corruption, oppression, shedding of innocent blood, poor leadership, sexual immorality, rising teen pregnancies, and mediocrity. Ask God to fulfil His promise in 2 Chronicles 7:14—that He would hear from heaven, forgive our sin, and heal our land.
- Ask God to pour out His Spirit upon Uganda and South Sudan and turn the hearts of people back to Him. Pray that corruption, greed, injustice, abuse of power, and selfish ambition would give way to righteousness, accountability, and servant leadership.
- Pray for presidents, government officials, members of parliament, judges, security agencies, local government leaders, and cultural leaders. Ask God to grant them wisdom, integrity, humility, courage, and the fear of the Lord as they lead.
- Ask God to establish peace, unity, and reconciliation throughout Uganda and South Sudan. Pray that He would heal divisions caused by tribalism, conflict, hatred, political differences, and historical wounds.
- Pray specifically for South Sudan. Ask God to strengthen peace-building efforts, bring stability to communities, protect vulnerable families, and guide leaders toward lasting unity and reconciliation.
- Pray for greater access to education, employment, entrepreneurship, discipleship, mentorship, and meaningful opportunities for the next generation. Ask God to bless

our economy so that it thrives and opens up lots of opportunities for a growing but young population.

- Pray that God's Kingdom would advance in every sphere of society—including government, education, business, media, healthcare, arts, sports, and community life.
- Ask God to use Uganda and South Sudan as lights in East Africa and beyond. Pray that the gospel would continue to spread throughout cities, towns, villages, and unreached communities.
- Thank God for His faithfulness to Uganda and South Sudan, and declare your confidence that He is able to do immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine for His glory.

Today's Challenge:

- Set aside 30 minutes each week to intentionally pray for Uganda and South Sudan. Pray for the Church, National Leaders, economy, families, young people, and the future of both nations. Consider doing this with your family, cell group, or a friend.
 - Identify one practical way you can contribute to the flourishing of your community this month. It could be serving a neighbour, encouraging a young person, supporting a vulnerable family, promoting peace and unity, or volunteering in a ministry initiative. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you how you can be part of God's answer to the prayers you are praying for your nation.

1 Samuel 3:10 (NIV)

“Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening.”

In Prayer:

Thank the Lord for all He has revealed to you this week. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you remain sensitive to His voice and faithful to obey what He has shown you.

Day 7: Respond And Commit

Psalm 37:5 (NLT)

Reflection becomes transformation when it leads to action. As you prepare for the second half of the year, take time to prayerfully respond to what God has been speaking to you.
